Talk about a mandate from the masses. In order to make things interesting, the next vote won't be so cut-and-dried. I present to you two four-mana permission spells, each with a tantalizing mechanic:



Dismiss, from the *Tempest* expansion, is what is known as a cantrip -- a card that replaces itself when it resolves. **Rewind**, from *Urza's Saga*, is graced with the "free mechanic" -- you get to untap four lands when it resolves, meaning you spent a net zero mana. Both cards were quite popular in their time, and it will be interesting to see which one ends up in *Eighth Edition*.

For the art choice, you get to choose between two different versions of the black common **Gravedigger** -- one illustrated by Dermot Power from the *Tempest* expansion, and one by James Bernardin from *Seventh Edition*.
